Imagine what it is like in Africa! Gas has gone past \$7.00 a gallon and the cost of food is through the roof. All of this for people making less than \$700 a year.

While we are all anxious about the future of our economy, we must be thankful that we are not among the poorest of the poor in the world and that we still have the capacity for compassion for others.

Within the next few weeks **Joining Hearts and Hands** will be sending out our annual newsletter which is our major fundraising drive. As you can imagine, donations to Joining Hearts and Hands have slowed dramatically due to the crisis in the economy. That crisis is exacerbated in the third world. Won't you help? Every little bit helps and a very little goes a long way in Kenya. The good news is that the Kenyan Shilling is near 77 Shillings per U.S. dollar! That's nearly a 30% increase in value since our mission visit to Kenya and Tanzania in June.
